



Names for Buckland and Wimbourne

Women's Intersectional History - focused on science, maths & medicine

For too long women in history have been ignored, forgotten or unrecognised. That's why we have chosen to name our apartments after women of note who walked the streets of Hackney over the past three hundred years. Recognised in the significant contribution they made to their fields of mathematices, science, engineering and medicine, we are proud to put their names to our buildings, where they will be remembered for future generations.

Streets ahead

These are women who were fearless, who fought to be heard and changed the future of science. True creatives in their field, their work benefited the wider community and paved the way for further pioneering.



Verena Holmes (1889-1964)

Holmes Court – Wimbourne St South Block

Inventor, mechanical engineer and writer, Holmes fought for women's equal opportunities, setting up training colleges for women engineers. Whilst building wooden propellors for World War I planes, she attended evening classes in Shoreditch Technical Institute, on Pitfield Street, Hoxton.

Unwavering in her determination to provide training opportunities for budding women engineers, Holmes helped set up the Women's Technical Services Register during the Second World War, which included a training course for women munitions workers to allow them to apply for roles such as junior draughtsmen and laboratory assistants. She went on to found the women only engineering firm of Holmes and Leather in1946 and became the first woman member elected to the Institute of Mechanical Engineers.

Elsie Hooper (1879-1969)

Hooper Court – Wimbourne St North Block

One of the first women pharmacists and an active suffragist, Hooper was born at 174 Amburst Road, Hackney, before being educated at Pond House, Clapton. A prominent businesswoman, she opened two pharmacists in London, offering employment for women.

The first woman in her field to receive two Pharmaceutical

Society scholarships, Hooper became a pioneering researcher and analyst.

She continued to campaign and march for women's suffrage, representing her profession in the Women's Coronation Procession, a 40,000-strong march from Westminster to the Albert Hall in support of votes for women.



Barbra Burford (1944 - 2010)

Burford Court – Buckland St Villa A

Medical researcher, healthcare pioneer and champion for equality and diversity.

Born in Jamaica, Burford moved to London in 1955. She was educated at Dalsty County Grammar School (now Petchy Academy) and studied medicine at London University.

A lifelong writer, active in feminist politics, her poems appeared in the first British Black Women's poetry anthology.

As a medical researcher for the NHS, she worked in electron microscopy, conducting groundbreaking studies in heart and lung transplant surgery for infants and children. Her research underpinned NHS diversity and inclusion guidelines and policies. As the director of diversity at the Department for Work and Pensionsfrom 2002 until 2005, she led the development of equality schemes to improve services for people from ethnic minorities.



Margaretta Beaufoy (1763 - 1800)

Beaufoy Court-Buckland St Villa B

Margaretta Beaufoy was born in London in 1788 and went on to elope with her cousin, eminent physicist and astronomer, Mark Beaufoy. After travelling together in Neuchatel, Switzerland, they set up home in Hackney, where Beaufoy's husband corresponded with the leading astronomers of his day both at home and abroad.

A talented mathematician living in a time when women's access to education was limited, Beaufoy worked alongside her husband, assisting him with various mathematical and astronomical calculations, most notably calculating the latitude to Mont Blanc. This resulted in her husband's successful climb to the summit in 1787, the first Englishman to achieve this accolade.

A lifelong resident of Hackney Wick, Margaretta Beaufoy is buried in St John's church yard.



Dr Helen Mackay (1891 – 1965)

Mackay Court-Buckland St Villa C

Mackay studied at the London School of Medicine for Women, before becoming the first female house physician and surgeon at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Children in Hackney. She went onto work at the Mothers' Hospital for 40 years, becoming the first woman fellow of the Royal College of Physicians.

Unmarried, Mackay cowrote a paper on anaemia with her lifelong companion, Loral Goodfellow.

She was one of the first women

members to be elected on the British Paediatrics Association in 1945.

A leading figure in childhood nutrition and preventive healthcare, her groundbreaking research into diet and rickets in children led to conclusive evidence of a link between iron deficiency and childhood anaemia. This led to new EU legislation requiring formula milk to be fortified with iron and for breastfeeding to be advocated over formula.

SHARED OWNERSHIP

25 homes will be available across both Wimbourne and Buckland sites for people working in Hackney who can't afford to buy outright.

What is shared ownership?

When you buy a home through our shared ownership scheme, you are buying the share that you can comfortably afford while paying rent to the Council for the share that you don't own. This means you'll take out a mortgage or pay in cash to buy a share (between 25 % and 75 % on most developments), and you will pay a subsidised rent for the share you haven't purchased. You will also pay a charge for the maintenance of the building and communal parts, known as a service charge.

Why choose Shared Ownership?

Shared ownership is popular because it gives people an affordable way into home ownership, and overall monthly costs are usually less than you would pay in rent for an equivalent property on the open market.

How much will it cost?

Shared ownership is a part-buy, part-rent way of owning your own home. By purchasing a share of a new home the deposit and mortgage you need will be less than if you were to buy the home in full on the open market. The initial share you can buy is between 25% and 75%*, with the rest owned by the Council.

You will raise a mortgage to buy the maximum share that you can afford** and pay rent on the remaining share you don't own. The monthly costs will usually be less than if you were buying the property outright or privately renting a comparable property.

You only buy what you can afford initially so that you don't overstretch yourself financially. After one year of ownership, you can buy more shares when you can afford to, or simply sell your share when you want to move.

Non-refundable Reservation Fee

If we are able to offer you a property we will ask you to pay £500 to reserve it. This is deducted from the final price of your purchase at completion.

Property Valuation

The amount you have to pay varies and in some cases additional fees may be required by your mortgage provider. Always ask your mortgage provider or mortgage adviser for a schedule of fees up front.

Legal Fees

You will need to instruct a solicitor to act on your behalf. Legal fees vary, so always ask for an estimate first. A solicitor who has experience of dealing with shared ownership sales will be able to give you a realistic quote or a fixed fee proposal.

Stamp Duty

Stamp duty will vary depending on the size of the share you buy and how you chose to pay it. Your solicitor will calculate this for you.
